Traumatic experiences are frequent and may cause serious consequences, affecting an individual, a larger group of people, or a whole society. Collective trauma might be a cataclysmic event that shatters the basic fabric of society leaving the profound acute and long lasting effects. In addition to loss of lives, huge injuries, collective trauma, or "social wounds", often arouses a crisis of meaning. Violence of and to young people is, unfortunately, widely spread and is a major challenge for public mental health. The causes might be multiple and should be thoroughly assessed, with an integrative, biopsychosocial approach (genetic predisposition, developmental problems, parenting, media, i.e. social influences, relationship with peers, and personality structure). Consequences of violence causing traumatic experience and consequences are profound, and a challenge for public mental health, with whole spectrum of psychological effects, both on individual and collective level. There is an urgent need for early detection and treatment of potential emerging violence in young people, as well as public health approach to trauma, prevention and mental health promotion. in schools and the whole society.
